

Distinction between Ordinary Bail & Anticipatory Bail

<u>Ordinary Bail</u>	Anticipatory Bail
1. This bail is granted after arrest.	1. This bail is granted before arrest.
2. These bail is granted by a magistrate (or) superior court.	2. These bail is granted by session (or) superior court.
3. These bail may be granted to any accused.	3. These bail may be granted to a respectable person having no criminal records (or) urgency matter.
4. Ordinary bail is generally granted in bail able offences.	4. It is granted in any offences.

Distinction between FIR & Charge Sheet

<u>FIR</u>	<u>Charge Sheet</u>
It is a preliminary report.	It is final report.
It is prepared by victim of crime.	It is prepared by investigation officer.
It is file in police station.	It is file in court.
It is having purpose of investigation.	It is having purpose of trail.
It can be with draw in petty offences.	It cannot be with draw.

Distinction between Probation & Parole

<u>Probation</u>	<u>Parole</u>
It is applicable to first time offender.	It is applicable to prisoner undergoing imprisonment.
There is an age limit of 21 years (or) less age.	There is no age limit.
It is object of rehabilitation.	It has object to develop affection with family and society.
It is used at the time of trial.	It is applicable when parole board consider it.
